PROGRAM PURPOSE

The purpose of the LSU Health Shreveport Ophthalmology “Resident and Alumni Conference” is to provide high quality lifelong learning opportunities that promote positive change in physician performance or competence, thus enabling such physicians to maintain or improve the knowledge, skills, and professional performance. The current activity will provide area ophthalmologists, LSU Health Shreveport faculty, alumni, and residents with the latest information regarding recent advances made in management of uveitis as well as new and emerging forms of infectious and non-infectious ocular inflammation. This will result in improved physician competency, better treatment outcomes and greater patient satisfaction. In addition, attendees will learn about the results of the residents’ clinical and basic science research projects.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

As a result of attending this activity, participants will acquire latest information regarding:

“Things Ophthalmologists need to know in uveitis”

- The important components of the evaluation of patients with oculo-inflammatory disease.
- The value of multidisciplinary care and factors which predispose to poor visual outcomes in patients with uveitis.

“New insights in uveitis and ocular inflammatory disease”

- Attendees will be made aware of the common drug-induced ocular adverse effects.
- Attendees will be made aware of newly identified and emerging forms of infectious and non-infectious ocular inflammation.

Attendees will also learn new information regarding the role of early YAG capsulotomy in improving visual performance of trifocal intraocular lens implantation, early outcomes of Durysta implant, outcomes and complications of Xen Gel Shunt glaucoma surgery, Penta Cam analysis pre and post cataract surgery, management of hypotony, treatment of aggressive ROP with ranibizumab, advanced orbital IgG4 disease, acquired Brown syndrome due to Onchocerciasis, ocular syphilis in Shreveport, and inferior 3rd nerve palsy after cardiac catheterization. The lectures will be followed by open discussion by Ophthalmologists, faculty, residents, and medical students for the formulation of consensus diagnostic and treatment approaches. These research briefs will increase the physician awareness of current clinical research and provide sources for future interactions leading to development of new treatment ideas, procedures, and clinical knowledge.

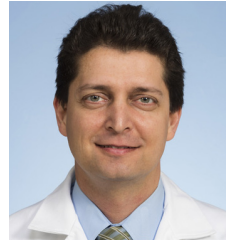

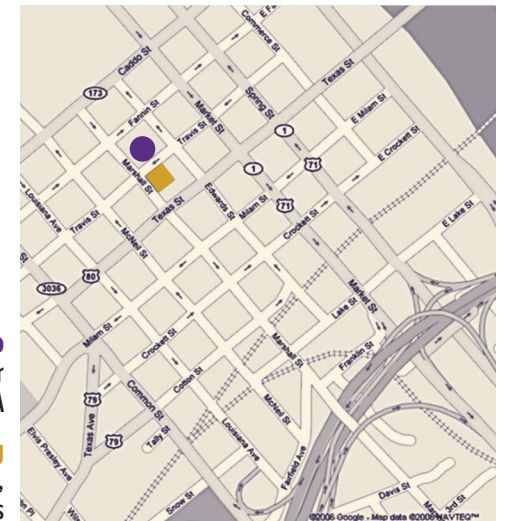
