THE HISTORY OF LSU SCHOOL OF MEDICINE IN SHREVEPORT

The 100th medical school to be established in the United States was created on Monday, May 31, 1965, when Representative J. Bennett Johnston, Jr. of Caddo Parish steered a bill through the House of Representatives in Baton Rouge to found a new medical school in Shreveport. The bill passed, fifty-seven to forty-three, in the House, and by June 7 of the same year the Senate authorized it and Governor John J. McKeithen put the finishing touch on the bill with his signature. So the Louisiana State University School of Medicine in Shreveport was formally created in roughly a week — but its

beginnings go back a little farther — ten years, in fact, before the bill ever hit the State Legislature. Since 1955, Dr. Joe E. Holoubek had headed a committee of the Shreveport Medical Society to get a medical school located in Shreveport.

So in June of 1965, after ten years of work, worry, but always optimism dreams were changed to realities and work was turned into more work and planning. A dean was needed for the school, and a dean was acquired — the "Dean of Louisiana medicine" — Dr. Edgar Hull. Dr. Hull, the associate dean of the LSU Medical Center, was named
